Gaylord Springs Golf Links Course captures the tradition and spirit of the game. It is carved from the banks of the Cumberland River, and has earned its place among the nation's best. The links style, par 72 layout, offers 18 challenging holes bordered by limestone bluffs and enhanced by federally protected wetlands. At the signature fourth hole, you will find the century-old springhouse from which the club derived its name. The course was designed by former U.S. Open and PGA champion Larry Nelson. It is the home of the Music City Championship, a stop on the PGA Champion Tour.

<p>Travel back in time, to the mid 1800's and the Civil War in <a href="#">Franklin, TN</a>, a unique blend of history and progress. Since 1799, it has grown from a tiny, agricultural community into a strong blend of residential, commercial and corporate citizens. The tour begins at the <a href="#">Carter House</a>, where over 1,000 bullet remain as a testament to one of the bloodiest battles of the American Civil War, and then a leisurely visit to the onsite museum. <a href="#">Carnton Plantation</a> is next, where lunch will be served on the porch. Featured in the New York Times bestseller, <a href="#">Widow of the South</a>, this elegant plantation home became a makeshift field hospital during the Battle of Franklin. Explore rooms used in battleground surgeries, ornamental gardens and the largest privately owned confederate cemetery in the country. Robert Hicks, <i>Widow of the South</i> author and Margie Thessin, Executive director, will lead the tour. The final stop, time permitting, will be the historic downtown district with quaint shops and antique stores.</p>

Begin your experience with a downtown driving tour on Historic 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave., State Capitol, bi-Centennial Mall &amp; World War II Memorial, Lower Broadway with the world famous Tootsie's Orchid Lounge and the original Ernest Tubb Record Shop. Stop at the Ryman Auditorium, a National Landmark, for a self-guided visit of where the Grand Ole Opry was performed from 1943 -1974. Continue on board with a drive through Centennial Park and a stop at the Parthenon. Lunch will be served at the Sunset Grill, Hillsboro Village. Then see special exhibits: "The Hank Williams Legacy" and "Dynamite: Brenda Lee" at the <a href="#">Country Music Hall of Fame &amp; Museum</a>.</p> <p><b>Tour #2 Cheekwood Gardens &amp; Art Museum</b> This tour features a 30,000sq ft Georgian-style mansion, and world class collections of American and contemporary paintings and sculptures, English and American decorative arts and traveling exhibitions. Signature pieces include the most comprehensive collection of Worcester porcelain in America. Stroll the grounds with a knowledgeable guide to learn about plants in the Cheekwood's estate as well as landscape architect Bryant Fleming's design for integrating the mansion and the landscape. You'll be inspired to enhance your own gardens after touring the Color Garden, the Wildflower Garden, the Herb Garden and the Japanese Garden. Lunch will be served in a private dining room.</p>

<p>At the <a href="#">Jack Daniels Distillery</a>, where every drop of Jack Daniel's Tennessee Whiskey is made, you'll see the special process that was developed in 1866. You may also enjoy the Visitor Center exhibit hall to learn more about the history of the founder and local brands of whiskey; all made with corn, rye, barley malt, and iron-free water from the limestone Cave Spring. Each comes of age on the Moore County hillside, maturing in newly charred, white oak barrels. They acquire their smooth charcoal-mellowed character by making the same journey drop by drop through 10 feet of hard sugar maple charcoal.</p> <p>Following the distillery tour, lunch will be served at <a href="#">Miss Mary Bobo's Boarding House</a>. True to Southern boarding house tradition, guests sit together at large family-style tables alongside a gracious Lynchburg hostess who encourages conversation, shares a bit of local lore, and ensures dishes are passed to the left. The menu includes generous helpings of two home-style meats, six vegetables, and side dishes; corn bread, biscuits or rolls; freshly brewed ice tea; homemade dessert, and a piping hot cup of coffees. After lunch explore historic Lynchburg Town Square and quaint shops.</p>
