**COL. MICHAEL J. "MIKE" MILLER** is program director of the Joint Program Office (JPMO) Household Goods Systems (HHGS) and Acting Program Executive Officer (PEO) for United States Transportation Command (USTRANSCOM), Scott Air Force Base, Ill. He's responsible for development and life-cycle support of computer applications for Department of Defense (DoD) HHGS worldwide, to include the Defense Personal Property System (DPS), for multiple product systems that automate a total supply chain for transportation services of \$2.1B per year. He leads a combined government, contractor, and industry team of 90 personnel. He manages computer system life-cycles to include concept, design, development, testing, implementation, and maintenance. Prior to this assignment, he was the director of the Defense Transportation Coordination Initiative (DTCI) Program Management Office (PMO) for USTRANSCOM. He led a Joint service and DoD agency effort partnering with a world-class, third-party logistics coordinator for transportation management services. In direct support of warfighters, DTCI improves the responsiveness, reliability, efficiency, and cost-effectiveness of DoD freight distribution within the continental US. Col. Miller entered active duty in May 1987 after he was graduated from the United States Air Force

Academy. Since then, he has served in a number of acquisition, engineering, teaching, staff, and leadership positions. As a Level III acquisition program manager, he has served in program management acquisition positions in transportation services, information technology, space systems, aeronautical systems, and propulsion.
