Jason Trubenbach is a Supervisory Transportation Planning Specialist with the Force Projection and Distribution Directorate in Headquarters, Department of the Army G-4. He is responsible for the policy and oversight of the Army's Power Projection Program, Army watercraft, Army rail and mobility studies. Mr. Trubenbach has served on the Headquarters, U.S. Army staff since May 2008.

From July 2010 to July 2011, Mr. Trubenbach was a Fellow in the Office of the Secretary of Defense Supply Chain and Transportation Fellows Program. As a Fellow, he worked various transportation and supply chain projects including: improving the in-transit visibility of cargo and use of automation systems in support of Afghanistan, ensured the sustainability and supportability of counter-IED systems through rapid acquisition, and provided greater awareness of threats posed by counterfeiting by identifying DoD anti-counterfeit training and developing an anti-counterfeit community website.

From 2004 to 2008, Mr. Trubenbach was a supervisory traffic management specialist assigned to the U.S. Army in Germany where he served as the Deputy Chief of the Distribution Management Center, assisting in the management of 318 personnel executing the Army in Europe's logistics enterprise. He also served as a senior traffic manager responsible for supporting Department of Defense surface movements in

over 35 regularly transited nations, managing 17 military, civilian and local national employees and overseeing the daily operations of three movement control battalions.

From 1999 through 2004, Mr. Trubenbach was a Transportation Officer in the United States Army, serving as a platoon leader, executive officer and staff officer in Germany, Turkey, Italy and Poland, his experience culminating with planning and seeing through execution the deployment of the 1st Infantry Division in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom.

Mr. Trubenbach has a Master's Degree in Management from the American Military University and holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in International Studies and History from the Virginia Military Institute. He is the recipient of the Superior Civilian Service Award, Achievement Medal for Civilian Service, Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Army Achievement Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, and the Global War on Terrorism Service Medal. Mr. Trubenbach received the National Defense Transportation Association's 2009 Junior Executive of the Year (Civilian) Award. He is also a recipient of the Boy Scouts of America's Eagle Scout Award.
