
RAYMOND P. EBELING

Raymond P. Ebeling is Chairman and CEO of the American Shipping and Logistics Group.

Mr. Ebeling is the Founder and Chairman of American Roll-On Roll-Off Carriers (ARC) established in 1990. ARC is a U.S. flag liner shipping company which owns and operates eight U.S. Flag Ro-Ro ships in global trade.

Mr. Ebeling is also Founder, Chairman and CEO of American Auto Logistics (AAL), a logistics management firm which has managed the global transportation of all military service members' vehicles since 1998.

Ray has also been President, since 1990, of Wallenius Lines Holding Inc. (WLHI), the U.S. subsidiary of Wallenius Lines of Stockholm, Sweden, a privately held shipping company which owns one of the world's largest Roll-On Roll-Off shipping fleets.

Mr. Ebeling was first elected Chairman of the National Defense Transportation Association (NDTA) in September, 2005. NDTA is a trade and educational association comprised of over 9,000 transportation and logistics professionals in the Department of Defense, other U.S. Government Departments, and the shipping, airline, trucking, railroad, and logistics industries.

Prior to joining the Wallenius and Wilhelmsen Groups, Ray held executive positions at SeaLand Service, including Vice President Marketing and Pricing. Prior to that, he was Vice President Pricing for SeaTrain Lines.

Mr. Ebeling has served on several advisory commissions to the U.S. Government including appointment by President Bush as Commissioner on the Advisory Commission on Conferences in Ocean Shipping.

In 2006, Mr. Ebeling received the "Connie Award" for his contributions to the container shipping industry.

In 2004, Mr. Ebeling was awarded the Admiral of the Ocean Seas Award (AOTOS), the U.S. shipping industry's highest honor, for "distinguished service to American Ships and American Seafarers".

In 2001, Mr. Ebeling was awarded the National Transportation Award by the National Defense Transportation Association (NDTA) "for exemplary contributions to his own industry and the transportation industry at large, in support of national security".

In 2000, Mr. Ebeling was awarded the Herb Brand Award by the Maritime Ports Council for "dedication to a strong and viable American Maritime Industry".

Mr. Ebeling is a native of Framingham, Massachusetts and presently resides in New Jersey with his wife Bonnie. He has received degrees in Economics from Bowdoin College and a Masters in Business Administration from Seattle University.
